Ms Lancuba will be Acting Principal of Coburg West Primary from the start of Term 3 until my return on August 27th. I trust you will all assist in making her feel welcome in our school.

Parent, Student and Teacher Meetings

Please note that the mid-year Parent, Student and Teacher Meetings are taking place next Wednesday 27th June. The meetings will be taking place between midday and 7pm. For those of you who have not yet made your bookings please do so via COMPASS.

These meetings are a good opportunity for parents to discuss the past semester's progress with their child and their teacher. Please note that it is a requirement for your child to be in the meeting with their teacher. **No child should be left in the playground without parental supervision.**

You are also reminded that each Meeting is allocated a 15-minute time slot and each teacher has many parents and students to meet with. Therefore, it is important that we stay to these time limits. If you are wishing additional time to meet with the teacher, you will need to make an additional appointment at a mutually agreed time.

First Aid Reminders

Please note the following important reminders from the nurses in First Aid;

- It is the responsibility of all parents and caregivers to update and replace their child's Epipens and medications. As medications reach their expiry dates they must be replaced. Please check with our school nurses if you are unsure of when to do so.
- Likewise, Action Plans for both Asthma and Anaphylaxis should be updated with your local doctor annually. As these Plans change, it is again the responsibility of parents or caregivers to ensure that a copy of the updated Action Plan is provided to our school nurses.
- As with any medications left with our school nurses, a Medication Administration Form **MUST** be completed by the parent or caregiver. This provides your authority for our school nurses to administer the medication as per your written instructions. Please note that medications will only be administered as per the written instructions you provide and sign for. No medications will be administered by any staff, without written instruction.

Buildings and Grounds Works

I am pleased to inform you that the bike and scooter racks have been installed in the bike cage. They look wonderful and the students are very excited to be storing their bikes and scooters in an orderly manner. Please join me in thanking Kimberley Palay for the time she put into sourcing the quotes and to everyone who has contributed to the Building Fund, which covered the cost of this installation. We are hoping that the additional concrete works will also occur during the holiday break.

You may have noticed that we recently had some works done to repair and improve the closing and latching mechanisms on many of our gates around the school grounds. Unfortunately, we have since had problems with another part literally falling off the back gate and another gate that is still not quite right. I apologize for the inconvenience caused to many of you as we continue to try to resolve these issues.

I recently advised that roof works were about to start on the Southern Building. There has been a delay, however it does now mean that the bulk of these works will take place over the school holiday period. There may still be works occurring upon our return, so I do ask that everyone is mindful of the areas around the grounds that are sectioned off, for their own safety.

CSIRO Acknowledge Ms Blatti

Just this week, Ms Blatti was formally acknowledged by the CSIRO, for the long-term, continued support she has demonstrated to the *STEM Professionals in Schools* program. SCHOOL COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to all who have a chance to take the time to read this report on the 2018 AGM and subsequent meeting of the School Council held on 20 June 2018.

It was a busy agenda and there was terrific vibe in a room full of educators and dedicated parents, all moving toward our common goal of ensuring that Coburg West continues to deliver outstanding educational outcomes for all of its students.

The AGM

The School Council was pleased to have a parent attendee at the School Council AGM. Our sole parent attendee, Caitlin Yates, also needs special mention as she has been kind enough to accept a position as the Secretary of the Coburg West School Community. This was validated by the School Council and it completes filling the office bearer positions for the Community group. We all wish Caitlin the very best for this important role.

On behalf of the School Council, we also congratulate the School Executive and Teaching Staff at CWPS on an outstanding report and encourage all parents to read the report which will shortly be posted on the School Website. As you will see, the school continues toward its mission of high growth for all students in reading and numeracy and the outcome is evident in the report.

As with any report card, there are areas for improvement and, in particular, the school is focusing on continuing to promote the wellbeing of our students. Classroom Libraries Project

As you may recall, at the last School Council Meeting it was agreed to exhaust the Library Fund into a new project aimed at developing classroom libraries of 500 books per class. There has been an incredible response to this project.

Not only has our Lead English Teacher Patricia Amerena managed to spend all of the funds on new books, but she has also secured free book deals (two for one type arrangements) with the suppliers. She has received and processed many donations from parents as well. We have, in one month, added over 2000 books to the school collection which is a fantastic result.

This is, however, no time for complacency and I encourage you all to continue to **DONATE YOUR OLD BOOKS** to the school. **BUY AN EXTRA COUPLE OF BOOKS** for the school next time you are at a book shop and drop them off. Perhaps speak with your **FRIENDS WITH OLDER KIDS** and see if they have any books which could be donated.

Books are critical to every aspect of the educational experience. They develop language skills, base knowledge, interest in the world, personal confidence, imagination and, ultimately, well rounded and intelligent adults. We are looking for **500 books for every classroom**, so we are still a long way from our goal. The School Council thanks you all for getting behind this important project.

IT Infrastructure

Just a quick note in relation to the CUA Funds raised and other IT development. A number of classrooms and working spaces have had installed much needed audio/visual equipment. Two classrooms in grade 5/6, the Art Room, a 3/4 Grade, a 1/2 Grade and our Library have had updated Audio Visual Systems installed. Acting Vice Principal Dan Copping has also arranged quotes to install a projector system for the large hall. This will allow presentations at School Assemblies (including the words to our National Anthem!) and a myriad of other uses.

School Building Works

CWPS has received funding to replace roofing at the school and has been going through a tender process to replace the roofs of the two main buildings at the school. At this stage, it would appear the successful tenderer will be replacing one roof (the Prep/1-2 Building) over the coming school holiday, and then the Department of Education will look to assess the cost of replacing/repairing the roof of the main building. We will keep you informed.

Also, I am pleased to report that the bike racks have been installed using funds from the building fund. The area is now being concreted thanks to the generosity of parents at the school. This completes the installation of the bike shed.

Community Group

The Community Group has been active and the next big event is the **parent's footy match** slated for **Sunday 5 August 2018**. There are 28 registered players and we encourage you all to get involved.

The big ticket item for raising funds through the footy match will be sponsorship of the event. Please consider sponsoring a player, the day or, if you have a business, perhaps you could reach out the community group and offer to run a stall on the day to fundraise. There is a lot of excitement around this event so please get involved.

Buildings, Grounds and Sustainability Committee

Congratulations to Justin Boots on the work that has been completed toward establishing this Committee. However, it is time to put the call out as we need your help. Please contact Justin on cwpsbuilding@gmail.com to help out with this Committee.

We need people who can assist with any aspect of maintaining the school and are just willing to give a bit of a hand. And please remember, this Committee also has a focus on sustainability and this is the opportunity for those concerned with the environment to make a meaningful contribution with the support of the School Council.

Principal Long Service

It is worth making a quick note in relation to the replacement for our Principal Mark Colagrande who is away next term on long service leave. A replacement has been secured, Carmel Lancuba from Roxburgh Rise PS. Please make Carmel feel welcome.

School Reporting

Finally, we are sure that you are all awaiting the reports on our children. Dan Copping and the senior education team have been working on a new method of reporting performance. This was presented to School Council and this looks to be a significant improvement. We are sure, however, that the School would appreciate any feedback on the reporting method as it strives for continuous improvement.

We hope that this provides a little insight into just some of the matters which were raised at the most recent School Council Meeting. On behalf of the entire Council, we wish you the very best for a safe and relaxing school break, and we look forward to a productive term 3.


